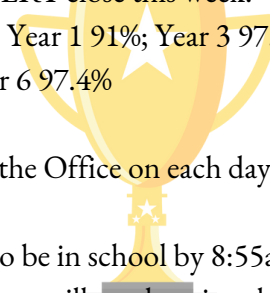

Nursery
