Nursery

What insects can you find in the garden?

Can you practise rolling a dice and saying the numbers as quickly as you can?

What was your favourite part of our day at the park?

Reception

Maths: what is the name of the counting grid we have been using with ten squares?

Topic (Animals and Habitats): what are the two things the Cave Salamander has lost by living in underground caves?

Phonics: what are the different types of suffix we have learnt and can you add them to a word?
