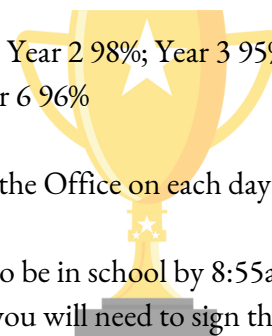
A brilliant start to the term - well done!
